I take this opportunity of welcoming fresh postgraduates to the world of medical fraternity. It is indeed a rare privilege for any human being to have been chosen by God to serve mankind. Having spent almost 40 years in my medical profession, I can assure you that this is one of the finest profession to be

associated with. Now that all of you will be the part of the patient doctor relationship, it is important to remember not only the 'dictates' of Hippocrates but also his scientific ideals. Hippocrates was the first to highlight that all human beings have inherent healing capacity to the tune of 25-35 percent, which we call in medical science as a placebo effect. This simple philosophy would remind you while treating your patient that just don't only treat the disease but treat the whole human being for exclusive results of your efforts.

This would also perhaps keep you reminding that it is the patient, who story is the best data and, diagnostic are only value addition. In clinical practice, you will have lot of clinico-investigatory disassociation but your focus should be on treating the patient rather than the investigation.
